The regular meeting of the Mayor and Council convened at 6:30 p.m. on Monday, April 20, 2026, at the Train Depot with the announcement of a quorum.

ADOPTION OF AGENDA

- Tommy Beeland made a motion to adopt the proposed agenda by adding Police Department server under New Business. Also, adding property under executive session. Bill Mims seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion passed.

FIRE CHIEF REPORT

FINANCE REPORT – City Clerk updated council on the progress with ERP 10 Tyler with finance and payroll systems. City Clerk also asked on behalf of the TC Chamber for permission to close William Wainwright on June 18th for karaoke and food truck. Bill Mims made a motion to close William Wainwright on June 18th and S Macon Street. George Stokes seconded the motion. All

voted in favor and the motion carried. Clerk also thanked the Women's Club and Strawberry Festival Committee for donating to the city for the flowers.

POLICE REPORT – Chief Holder gave the condolences to the City of Butler for the loss of the mayor. The police department purchased the golf cart to use at Strawberry Festival.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT – Director Scott Jones updated council on the water project regarding USDA loan. The CDBG project is in a holding pattern until the deeds are completed and property owners have signed off on the offers. Director Jones presented the quote on the new Kubota tractor at \$52,005.00 from Mason Tractor Company. Bill Mims made a motion to purchase the tractor from Mason Tractor Company at \$52,005.00 to be paid from Tsplost fund. Mayor Pro-tem Hannah Sloan seconded the motion. Brandon Hunter abstained from the vote due to conflict of interest. All others voted in favor and the motion carried.

- **Cemetery Lots** – Bill Mims made a motion to move forward with City Clerk getting quotes / proposals for ground penetrating radar and mapping of the cemetery. George Stokes seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

- **Police Department Server** – Bill Mims made a motion to approve the purchase of the server from Neos in the amount of \$10,347.98 using Solar funds. Tommy Beeland seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.
